



Middlesex Cricket Coach Education Programme 2016/2017

Important Information

For candidates wishing to attend a level 2 course please note the following:

Middlesex Cricket strongly advises that you select the course appropriate to the age and stage of players you are currently, or are intending to work with (Coaching Children, 6-13 years of age or Coaching Young People and Adults, 14 and above) as the course competencies are linked to this information. From previous courses, candidates selected YPA courses based on their intention to progress onto a Level 3 course, however due to the course content not matching the players age and stage they did not reach competency on course.

1) Coach Support Environment

ECB Coach Support Worker

Who Should Attend:

Individuals wishing to assist under the direct supervision of ECB qualified coaches in the delivery of high quality practical cricket coaching sessions within a club environment.

Commitment:

Attend a 6-hour workshop

Pre-Requisites for Certification:

Current ECB DBS, Safeguarding & Protecting Young Cricketers (this is an online assessment that must be completed before the course which will be sent to candidates when they register), Minimum age of 16 to attend.

PLEASE NOTE THAT PLACES WILL NOT BE BOOKED UNLESS A COMPLETED APPLICATION FORM AND PAYMENT/ PAYMENT DETAILS ARE RECEIVED. IF AN INCOMPLETED FORM IS RECEIVED OR NO PAYMENT THEN PLACES WILL BE OFFERED TO OTHERS ON A FIRST COME FIRST SERVE BASIS.

Borough Development Groups/Clubs can request to host local Coach Support Worker courses over 2 x 3hr weeknight modules. Groups/Clubs will need to source a venue and a minimum of 16 candidates in order for the course to take place. To discuss this further please email coach.education@middlesexccc.com.

ECB Cricket Activator

Activator courses can be requested by borough groups, clubs, schools or local community groups with the syllabus being tailored based on needs. Aspects of coaching, officiating, event management and health and safety can be covered within this course.

Candidates must be aged 14 years or over to attend and in order to be certificated will need to complete and evidence 10 hours of volunteering within the county or at a club/school.

Course Cost: £400 (10 candidates) £25 for each candidate after this.

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Level 2 Assessment Days

These extra assessment days are for candidates who still need to complete their practical assessment as part of a previous level 2 course. Candidates have two years from the start date of their course to have completed all dates, practical assessment, online learning, SYC, First Aid and have an ECB DBS check in place. If any of these are missing, then certification cannot be awarded. Candidates who are still within their two-year window and need to complete their assessment need to attend one of the below dates.

2) Coaching Children Environment

ECB Certificate in Coaching Children (UKCC2)

Who Should Attend?

Coaches who are going to coach Children from 6 to 13 years of age. They may be existing UKCC1/ECB L1/Coach Support Workers or Young Person and Adult coaches who wish to access 'child specific' content. Please note a coach working with an U12 group and who will continue to move up with them in the following years, could consider the YPA course. Please ensure you have read the guidance on course selection at the beginning of this document.

Commitment

Coaches will be required to attend four course dates*, complete an online assessment and 6 hours of supported practice sessions in their own Club Coaching environment before the final day of the course. The final course date includes the practical assessment. Supported practice must be supervised by a qualified coach (minimum level 2 or equivalent). **All dates of the same course must be attended.**



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* We will be running an Introduction to Level 2 session which will cover details of the supported practice requirements, further information on the safeguarding and protecting children assessment, sign off of DBS forms and completion of a first aid course. The first aid course will be at a cost of £25 and places will be issued on a first come first serve basis. This session is designed to create ease for candidates and we strongly recommend it is attended in order for pre requisites to be met prior to the course, to provide an opportunity to meet the tutors and fellow candidates and to ask any questions ahead of the course. Please note that this is not mandatory but please be advised that if not attended it is then the candidate's responsibility to organise all pre requisites themselves.

Pre-requisites for Certification

- Emergency First Aid Certificate (please provide evidence of this when applying if already held). **IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Online courses are not able to be accepted for compliance. All coaches must attend a face to face first aid course and we must have evidence of this for certification**
 - Safeguarding & Protecting Young Cricketers (this is an online assessment that must be completed before the first day of the course which will be sent to candidates when they register)
 - Current ECB DBS – It is mandatory that all candidates have as a minimum had their DBS check verified and have sent this off to GB group in order to apply for a course place. On application you will need to provide the date of your current check or the name of the evidence checker who verified your form and their contact details so this can be confirmed.
 - Aged 17 years at least to begin the course. Candidates can be assessed at 17 but they will not receive certification until they have turned 18.
- Clubs, please note that any candidate who completes the course but is not 18 cannot be included as a Level 2 coach in Clubmark ratios until they have been certificated.

Missing any of these requirements will delay certification on completion of the course.

Although not mandatory we strongly recommend that anyone who has not previously gained a Level 1 cricket coaching qualification should attend a Coach Support Worker Course before applying for a place on a Level 2 course.

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3) Coaching Young People & Adult Environment

Certificate in Coaching Young People and Adults (UKCC2)

Who Should Attend:

Coaches who are going to Coach Young People and Adults in 'Open Age' Cricket (predominantly aged over 14). They may be existing UKCC1/ECB L1 or Child coaches who wish to access 'young person and adult specific' content. Please ensure you have read the guidance on course selection at the beginning of this document.

Commitment:

Coaches will be required to attend four* course dates, complete an online assessment and 6 hours of supported practice sessions in their own Club Coaching environment before the final day of the course. The final course date includes the practical assessment. Supported practice must be supervised by a qualified coach (minimum level 2 or equivalent). **All dates of the same course must be attended.**

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Continuous Professional Development (CPD) Modules

This programme of three stage and age appropriate CPD workshops will develop the knowledge, understanding and applied skills of coaches working either with Young People and Adults in the club environment. It is aimed at coaches that hold the ECB Certificate in Coaching Young People and Adults' Cricket or the old Level 2/ equivalent qualification. Successful completion of the three CPD modules contribute to coaches' qualification for the ECB Diploma. Details will be given at the start of the programme.

When applying, coaches need to provide details of coaching qualification, club and coaching role.

YPA CPD Modules

ECB Training Interventions and Methods. This workshop will allow coaches to create and share inspiring group-based training interventions and methods within a club environment.	Saturday 12 th November 2016 (9am -12pm)	Middlesex Indoor Cricket School

Mandatory for all coaches working in schools on behalf of Middlesex Cricket. This course is designed to support coaches working in schools by giving them access to the latest government guidelines. Coaches must hold a minimum of a Level 2 coaching qualification in order to attend.
